

FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

What a year we have had! This annual report will memorialize a year serving women through a global pandemic and major social unrest in our communities. Through it all, our model and our philosophy of being a community for women who need us, proved strong and resilient. While the world shut down, we opened our door 1,500 times to meet the most basic needs of women and to offer masks, hand sanitizer, and the best available information. As domestic violence and hardship increased, we stepped in with rental assistance, food boxes, computer access, and emotional support.

We also persevered. We made a promise to our community that we will be there for people who don't have anyone to count on. Our staff took on shift work, faced their own fears of COVID-19, and learned to use technology in new ways. We are very proud of what CASH was able to do during a crisis.

Over the last 12 months, we continued a ground-breaking research project to determine the scope of sex-trafficking in Sacramento County. We are using a participatory research design, where our Survivor Advisory Council and our research team partner to determine the best way to understand this hidden problem. We have also dedicated ourselves to workforce development through our employment program, designed to remove barriers, and an internship program that gives women the chance to see themselves in a direct service career.

We do this work because it is needed in our community. We are grateful that every year more people understand commercial sexual exploitation and the impact it has on women and families in our community. We are committed to being a place of hope for women. For us that means having a welcoming open door, offering programs with impact, and asking for changes to systems that perpetuate inequity and hardship. As always, we look forward to increasing what is possible for women, their families, and our community.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

• We served **300** women.


- Supported 39 pregnant women with mentoring, education, and access to quality medical care.
- Provided 4,000 meals.
- Partnered with one of the One Community Health to Provide 70 HIV tests.
- Diverted 60 women from the criminal justice system through our RESET prostitution diversion program.
- Assisted 69 women through our comprehensive Opening Doors Anti-Trafficking & Victim of Crimes programs.
- Helped 12 women stay housed during pandemic with emergency assistance.
- Provided care to 9 women with Shelter Plus Care Vouchers.

2021/2022 Goals

We are focusing our attention on intervening at the earliest point in a woman's life. That means robust programming for youth who have been trafficked, pregnant woman, and those in early recovery. We will also conclude our 3-year research project estimating the scope of sex trafficking in Sacramento County. We will use this information, along with the expertise of our Survivor Advisory Council, to recommend prevention efforts. Finally, we will continue to build community in every way possible. We know that belonging heals and being part of a community that cares changes lives.
