Since inception, we have worked to understand the experiences of women who have been commercially sexually exploited and have invested in their dreams.

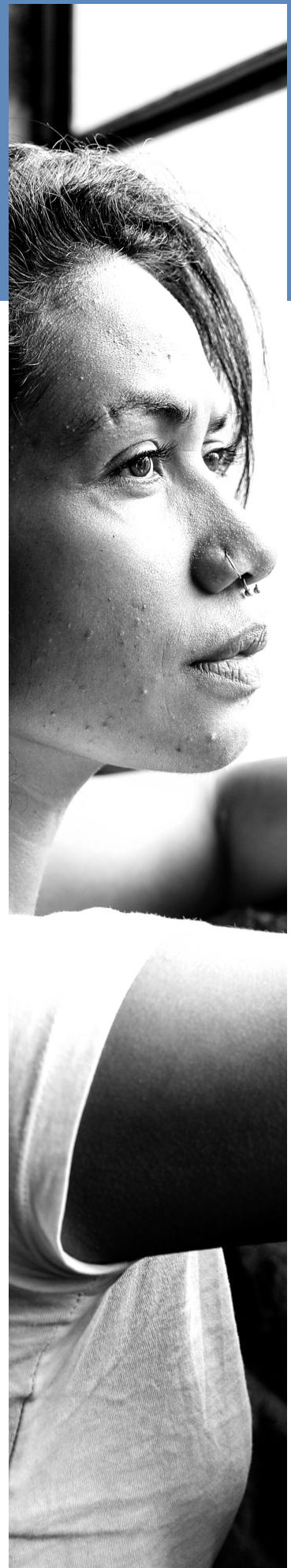
Today, we are able to meet the most basic needs of any woman who walks through our door. We also offer a variety of housing assistance, mentoring, wrap around care, connections to medical and mental health providers, linkages to in-patient substance abuse treatment, and educational support. Most importantly, we do this work from our peer-led Center for Women. **This is a place of community and belonging for women that builds resiliency. It is a place where dreams are possible.**

This year, permanent supportive housing was possible for women who had been living in tents, healthy babies for moms who struggled with addiction, and employment for women who thought prostitution was their only option. Every day women achieve things they never thought possible. We've also assembled an amazing team of researchers, community organizations, survivors, and local agencies to understand the scope of sex-trafficking in Sacramento County. This project will guide future prevention efforts throughout our County.

This annual report shares our successes for 2019 and highlights all that we are working on in 2020. We believe in the women we serve and are grateful to be able to help them achieve their dreams.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

2019 SUCCESSES

- We served **330** women.
- Supported **41** pregnant women with mentoring, education, and access to quality medical care.
- Provided **5,000** meals.
- Partnered with one of the One Community Health to Provide **120** HIV tests.
- Diverted **78** women from the criminal justice system through our RESET prostitution diversion program.
- Assisted **60** women through our comprehensive Opening Doors Anti-Trafficking & Victim of Crimes programs.
- Developed **2** toolkits to help educate the community about HIV and the risk for women.
- Helped **9** women secure Shelter Plus Care Vouchers.

2020 GOALS

We are focusing on ending chronic homelessness for the women we serve, increasing residential stability for families, and improving educational and employment outcomes. Helping commercially sexually exploited women create safe and stable lives continues to guide our work. We are also expanding survivor leadership opportunities, advocating for a comprehensive and accessible approach to care, and looking at opportunities for primary prevention.

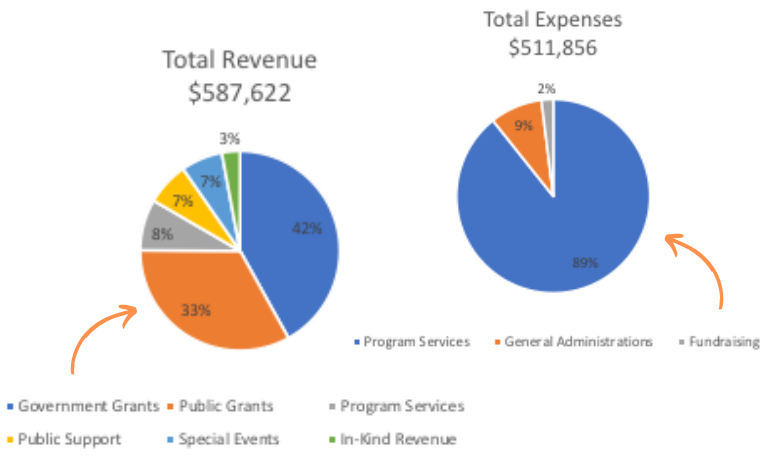
